

PUPIL NON-DISCRIMINATION

No person may be denied admission to any public school or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil services, recreational or other program or activity because of any protected category under state or federal law.

Discrimination is prohibited in all areas, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Admission to any school, class, program or activity. This does not prohibit placing a pupil in a school, class, program or activity based on objective standards of individual performance or need.
 - b. Standards and rules of behavior, including pupil harassment.
 - c. Disciplinary actions, including suspensions and expulsions.
 - d. Acceptance and administration of gifts, bequests, scholarships and other aids, benefits, or services to pupils from private agencies, organizations or persons.
 - e. An instructional and library media materials evaluation and selection policy consistent with s.121.02 (1) (h), Stats., and s. PI 8.01(2) (h) that provide adequate instructional materials, texts, and library services which depict in an accurate and unbiased way the cultural diversity and pluralistic nature of American Society.
 - f. Methods, practices and materials used for testing, evaluating and counseling pupils. This does not prohibit the use of special testing, counseling materials, or techniques to meet the individual needs of pupils.
 - g. Facilities. This does not prohibit separate locker rooms, showers and toilets for males and females, but the separate facilities must be comparable.
 - h. Opportunity for participation in athletic programs or activities. This does not prohibit separate programs in interscholastic athletics for males and females, but the programs shall be comparable in type, scope and support from the School District. This does not prohibit placing a pupil in a school, class, program or activity based on objective standards of individual performance or need.
 - i. School sponsored food service programs.
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Nondiscrimination notices shall be printed in the student handbook, course selection book, enrollment materials, and published annually in August in the local newspaper.

Concerns regarding alleged violations of this policy shall be referred to the Superintendent of Schools, 2501 W. Fifth Avenue, Brodhead, WI 53520. A procedure for processing the complaint is found in the Discrimination Complaint Procedure policy, JBA.
