

WISCONSIN SPECIAL OBSERVANCE DAYS

The Wisconsin legislature has established a number of “Public Schools Observance Days”. Honoring observance days can teach the elements of tradition necessary for preservation of United States society. These days give honored individuals and events proper emphasis both in the context of Wisconsin and U.S. history, and in relation to the political, economic, and social institutions affected or improved.

Each school in the District will observe each special observance day identified by statute in an appropriate fashion. Building principals are responsible for establishing the observance activities.

When an observance day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, Wisconsin statutes provide that the day is to be observed on the preceding Friday or the following Monday.
