

PARTICIPATION OF NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN
DISTRICT PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES

Resident and non-resident non-public school students including students enrolled in a private, parochial school, or a home-based private educational program may participate in courses, programs or activities in the Brodhead Public School as follows:

1. The request for admission shall be in writing, along with the signature of the non-public school principal approving the request (parent in the case of home school student).
 2. The public school class(es) and/or program(s) requested is not at the maximum number of students for that grade and/or space is available without overcrowding the existing class(es) and/or program as determined by the principal and/or program director.
 3. The student must be age appropriate and academically qualified or otherwise eligible to meet the course and/or program requirements.
 4. Non-public school students may take up to two (2) courses per semester at the High School (9-12). They may take any courses offered. At the K-8 level students may take up to two (2) classes in: art, music, physical education, technical education and foreign language. These students will be assessed the same student registration fee that all students at their grade level must pay.
 5. Non-public school students may not participate in activities or co-curricular offerings that have specific exclusionary language, nor may they participate in youth apprenticeships and post secondary options.
 6. Non-public school students who are residents of the School District of Brodhead may be allowed to participate in summer school classes.
 7. Non-public students will be assessed the regular student book and/or course fee as appropriate. Upon enrollment, non-public students must provide required emergency and medical information.
 8. Transportation of the non-public school student will not be the responsibility of the School District of Brodhead.
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A decision denying any request may be appealed to the Superintendent of Schools. If not resolved by the Superintendent, an appeal may be made to the Board of Education.

Written requests should be submitted by July 1 for the succeeding school year and Semester I. A final decision will be made by the week prior to the start of school. An application should be submitted by October 1 for Semester II. A final decision will be made by the week prior to the start of second semester. A student must reapply in a timely manner for admission each semester.

The School District shall not discriminate on the basis of any protected category under Wisconsin or Federal Statute.
