Response to Intervention (RtI) is a multi-levelled system of supports intended to find students who need help and offer a variety of resources to support academic or behavioral needs.

When We Meet

Rti teams in each building have standing monthly meeting times. School staff meet promptly when a new student is nominated to the team. Parents are welcome, but not required to attend meetings.

Intervention Plan

As a result of the meeting, an informal plan is written that describes the student's strengths, teacher or parent concerns, and the strategies and supports we are putting in place to help the student. The RtI plan includes a goal for what we want to see improve or change for the student, as well as a follow up date the team will meet to review progress.
