- 6. Perform filling technique of oxygen canisters as needed.
- 7. Maintain patient confidentiality at all times.
- 8. Communicate as needed to any of the following:
 - a. Emergency Medical Technicians.
 - b. Law Enforcement Personnel.
 - c. Fire Personnel.
 - d. Family Members of Patients.
 - e. Patients.
 - f. Hospital Personnel.
